English Formal Curriculum

Our school is a student-oriented school. All teachers are specialists in their subjects and make use of the most suitable classroom learning strategies to enhance teaching effectiveness. We designed a systematic and contextual school-based English curriculum. Using technology and diverse learning activities, students build self-confidence and cultivate learning motivation in learning English, and also realize the importance of English in their daily lives.

Systematic Learning Process

Two Native-speaking English Teachers (NETs) coordinate the English lessons for both key stage 1 and 2 respectively. During the curriculum planning stage, the teaching team designed a systematic curriculum structure according to the characteristics and needs of students at different learning stages.

The P. 1-3 curriculum places emphasis on the development of reading and speaking. By combining activity-based lessons with collaborative teaching with the NETs, students can achieve a solid foundation for English vocabulary and pronunciation. The P. 4-6 English curriculum promotes "from reading to writing", and at the same time it incorporates higher-order thinking skills, it cultivates generic skills, and it helps







Oxford RWI Phonics Literacy Programme

Students need a solid foundation upon which their language skills can grow and develop, and phonics is an important component. Therefore, our school has joined the Oxford RWI phonics literacy programme that was developed in the United Kingdom. This programme is a way for children to learn to read using phonics, which also extends to listening, speaking, and writing skills. The teaching team makes good use of the readers and resources provided by the popular programme. These materials not only teach phonics skills, but also include elements of world culture to enhance the cognition of world knowledge and improve cultural literacy.





Cultivating Language Literacy

In order to further expand the depth and breadth of students' reading, the school uses a variety of reading media, from physical books to electronic reading. These resources are set to build the reading atmosphere throughout the school. To promote English reading, the school purchased the "Oxford Story Tree" series for lower primary school students. The vocabulary and sentences in the stories are adapted to better fit with the local English curriculum. Not only does it stimulate the students' learning process, but also arouses the interest in reading through interesting stories. For upper primary school students, a variety of books are purchased from world renowned authors, such as, Roald Dahl and Julia Donaldson.

EPIC! and Read with Mr Men are two online reading platforms installed on students' iPads that coordinate with the school's reading strategy. The platforms provide tens of thousands of English books for students to choose from according to their reading level and preferences. They can also do the post reading activities after reading. Our teachers can review students' reading ability and performance through the system and provide appropriate feedback to improve their English and to enhance their interest.





English Informal Curriculum (Life-wide Learning)

Life-wide learning refers to student learning in real contexts and authentic settings. Such experiential learning enables students to achieve certain learning goals that are more difficult to attain through classroom learning alone.

Comprehensive English Activities

Our school hosts "English Fun Week" several times each school year according to different festivals and themes. The teaching team focuses on providing learning opportunities for students before, during and after the event, and they can attain different skills during the process. Before the activity is held, the teacher will set up a pre-learning task on the electronic platform, and students will self-study through e-learning. During the activities, students will participate in a variety of activities in different corners of the campus during recess and tutorial class. Later, in the postactivity sharing session and extension activities, students will share their experience with schoolmates.





The English Section organises the "Online English Morning Meeting" and "US Vlog" as an alternative to cross-level and cross-class face-to-face teaching activities. The Online English Morning Club has a monthly theme, inviting students to conduct sky-air reports, Bible readings, Recitation of the Lord's Prayer, etc. in English. They will also launch a 'song of the month' every month to increase their interest in learning English. US Vlog is hosted by an English teacher who has emigrated to the United States, students can experience American life while learning English and implement transnational culture learning.





Teachers and students experience travelling around the world together and celebrate various festivals on English Fun Day. Feel the fun of travelling and the atmosphere of world festivals, as well as learning about the world through English together!

Exploring English through DTS P1 students decide what a good pet is!

Starting from the school year of 2021-22, our school subscribed to the Development of Text Set (DTS) program offered by the NET Section, EDB. The program encourages educators to give greater space for students to explore, brainstorm and describe their thoughts and preferences by using a wide range of text types. Our school started integrating this concept to the teaching of a Primary 1 Unit this year, allowing students to explore further on 'what makes a good pet'.

In order to further enhance students' learning interest and personal experiences relevant to the theme of learning, our school organized an animal encounter workshop with Li Ivan for Primary 1 students in late July. During the workshop, students roamed around the room to learn and observe different reptiles. mammals and amphibians. Through comparing the characteristics of these species, students integrated their previous knowledge in explaining their ideal pet. Many of them were ecstatic when touching and holding the pets shown.
